Chain migration curse

Since Senator Ted Kennedy's rework of U.S. immigration policy in 1965, as part of President Johnson's "Great Society," 72 million people are now living here who are foreign-born immigrants. It's the largest movement of people to one country in history, yet Democrats scream that we aren't allowing enough people into our nation.

Thanks to chain migration, 9.3 million green cards were issued to immigrants on the basis of family ties in the ten year period from 2005 to 2015, according to the USCIS (U.S. Customs and Immigration Service). In one example, 141,501 Bangladeshi nationals have entered the U.S. since 2005, largely due to chain migration.

In 2016, 44% of "green card" immigrants came here through chain migration.

Akayed Ullah, the 27 year-old Islamist jihadi who ignited his explosive vest prematurely in a New York City subway station back in December, is a Bangladeshi who entered the U.S. in 2011 through chain migration, along with his immediate family.

In National Review on December 12, 2017 Andrew Arthur from CIS (Center for Immigration Studies) highlighted the problem with chain migration: "No investment in the United States, its systems or beliefs, or its institutions, is necessary. Not even support for its economic success is a prerequisite for admission. The only tie and admission requirement is one of blood."

CIS numbers show that the immigrant population in the U.S. hit 43.7 million in 2016, 13.7% of the population. Immigrants (mostly legal) in the U.S. have doubled since 1990, tripled since 1980, and quadrupled since 1970. Today, one-third of children live in an immigrant household and one in five people in the U.S. is an immigrant. During the Obama Regime, the greatest increases were seen from countries in the Middle East, Asia, Latin America and Sub-Saharan Africa. During Obama's last year, 2016, immigration from Mexico, Canada, and European nations declined or was nearly flat.

Democrats have one objective: continue the plans laid by Senator Ted Kennedy in 1965 and "transform" the nation, ala Obama.

The DACA Dance

President Trump was direct; at a televised meeting with well over a dozen members of Congress last Tuesday that lasted over an hour, he stated emphatically that any immigration proposal forwarded to him by Congress *must* contain funding for a border wall. He publicly praised the attendees at that meeting, calling it "the greatest meeting ever." Trump received accolades for the "historic" open meeting from various sources, including the press.

The euphoria lasted until Thursday, January 11, when President Donald Trump met with the "Gang of Six" congressmen and reviewed their proposal. Essentially an Establishment solution for preserving the DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) program, the new "plan" resuscitated the unconstitutional executive action implemented by former President Barack Obama in June, 2012, which was done without legal authority or the approval of Congress. DACA was halted by Trump last fall.

Any discussion of a "DACA fix" must include certain items on Trump's immigration reform list: Fund construction of a wall on the U.S. southern border; hire 10,000 more ICE and border patrol agents and 300 additional prosecutors; crack down on sanctuary cities; stop chain migration; end the visa lottery program; and, as in the RAISE Act proposal, institute a "smart" (meritbased) immigration system, such as a pointbased system for green cards.

The legislative product presented to President Trump on January 11 by the Gang of Six, was a gross insult. Trump asked congressmen from both parties at the meeting earlier in the week to send him an immigration plan. They delivered a joke.

Their "plan" expanded chain migration and greatly increased DACA (awarding citizenship and sponsorship of relatives and parents for renewable three-year periods). It devoted a paltry \$1.6 billion for a border wall and a fraction of that for border enforcement. The silly "bipartisan" proposal put new constraints on the DHS (Department of Homeland Security) that would hamper the actual building of the wall and

Basically, the plan *increased* chain migration, *increased* illegal immigration, and imported *more* low-skilled labor. Republican leadership rewarded their donors and the Democrat leadership gained voters.

Congressmen who comprise the Gang of Six and Establishment members in both political parties have grossly misread this president. He hasn't "softened" his views after the televised immigration meeting.

Trump is *very* frustrated, but apparently somewhat naive. Does he actually think that elected officials in Congress received the message of the 2016 presidential election, when voters emphatically demanded an end to the illegal alien invasion of their nation?
